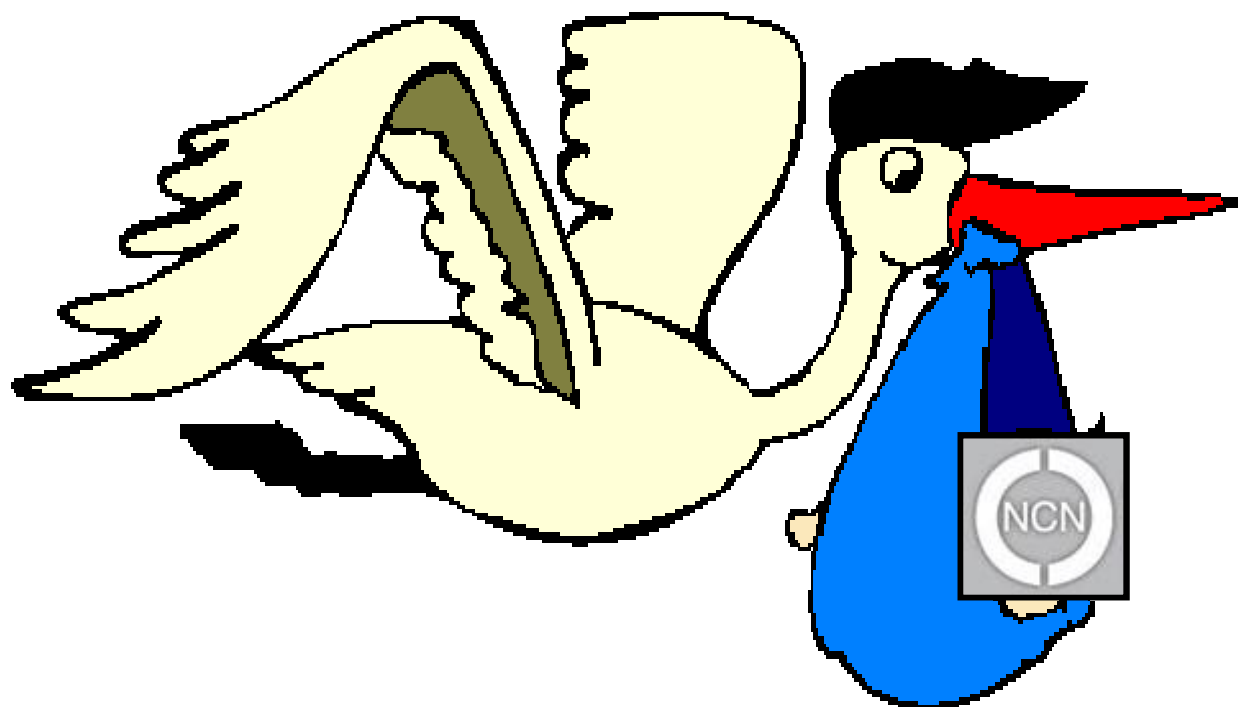

History



THE JOANNA BRIGGS INSTITUTE

2006

- Preliminary discussions between Joanna-Briggs Institute (JBI) and the Australian Cochrane Center
- JBI received funding from the Australian Government for a period of two years to support the initial establishment of a nursing entity

2007: Exploratory meeting

- Dundee, Scotland, 30th April



History

Purpose of the Exploratory meeting in Dundee:

1. To propose a Cochrane Nursing Care Network to engage nurses with the Cochrane Collaboration and to represent nursing care to Review Groups and Fields.
2. To consider greater involvement of nurses in Cochrane activities essential for an increase in the uptake of evidence within the international health community.

Current State

- The CNCN is one of the 16 Fields and Networks within the Cochrane Collaboration.
- The core functions of the CNCN fall into three major areas related to the production and use of Cochrane reviews:
 1. **Supporting** preparation of reviews relevant to nursing
 2. **Introducing cross-cutting, non-specialised perspectives** relevant to all those providing nursing care (nurses, other disciplines such as social work, families and lay caregivers)
 3. **Enhancing the dissemination and effective uptake** of Cochrane reviews.

- CNCN is coordinated centrally and supported by regional nodes and network groups
- Central coordination is provided from a dedicated unit within the Joanna Briggs Institute at the University of Adelaide
